**Christmas Packages On Way to Vietnam**

Some 10,000 gift bags are on their way to Vietnam where they will be distributed to servicemen for Christmas — thanks to the Los Angeles Red Cross Chapter and several hundred of its volunteers, including nearly 70 from Southern Los Angeles communities.

The project, which started three months ago with the distribution of green denim squares to volunteers willing to stitch them into drawstring bags, is part of the American National Red Cross effort to provide each of the more than 500,000 servicemen and women in Vietnam a sack of individually-wrapped gifts.

Last week, volunteers reported to the Southern District Red Cross Service Center in San Pedro and to five other Los Angeles Chapter Service Centers where they wrapped 80,000 presents, stuffed them into bags with a Christmas card, and boxed them for shipping overseas. During the wrapping

"bees," volunteers viewed slides showing Red Cross workers as they distributed the gift bags last Christmas Day and servicemen writing thank you notes to those who had contributed time and money on the project.

For this, the third year of the project, gifts included writing utensils, hard candies, a pocket knife, playing cards, flavored soft drink powder, and wetlettes for the men, and hand, suntan, and face lotions for the women.

Mrs. Eric M. Jacobsen coordinated the project locally.
