## Debate Series Slated

Competition begins this weekend for the El Camino forensics team when they enter the Pacific Southwest College Forensic Association's Preview Tournament at UCLA.

The preview tournament was preceded by a PSCFA seminar Oct. 5 to familiarize beginning speakers with this year's national proposition

and demonstrate the individual forensic events.

El Camino will sponsor two such tournaments this semester. The PSCFA warm-up tournament is scheduled for Oct. 25 and 26. For the second year El Camino will host a tournament for local high schools tentatively planned for Jan. 11.

THE PSCFA warm-up is expected to attract between 350 and 400 participants representing 35 colleges and universities from Southern California, Arizona and Utah. The non-trophy event will include competition in debate, as well as extemporaneous, impromptu

and expository speaking, according to Nathan Lillenthal, forensics coach.

The forensics team currently has five debate squads.

"Two of the squads have considerable high school experience while two others are novice status. The debate squads have undergone extensive practice in preparation for competition this fall. Many members have been preparing since August," Lillenthal said.
