

South Undergoes 68-69 Evaluation

Principal Dr. John A. Lucas has announced that South High School administrator, faculty and students will be evaluating the instructional program to renew its accreditation during this school year.

South High received maximum accreditation in 1964, approval of the instructional program for a five-year period by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges.

Dr. John B. Brinegar, Superintendent of the Claremont Unified School District, has been named Chairman of the Visiting Committee by committee members selected the association. He and other throughout the state will study the evaluation report and visit the South High campus April 14 to 16 for final appraisal.

The Western Association of Schools and Colleges is the regional accrediting association. The roster of accredited schools, published by this association, becomes the official list to be used by those institutions and governmental agencies wishing to

recognize the accredited secondary schools of this area. In addition, the certificate issued to the school signifies to the Board of Trustees and to the community that the school is not only meeting minimal standards but is actively engaged in a continuous process of upgrading all aspects of its educational program.

1,500 Schools Expected To Enter Essay Contest

Greek Foods Featured At Peninsula Art Show

Lovers of Greek food will be able to eat their fill at the Gourmet Food Section of Art for Fun(d)'s Sake Art Festival this weekend on the grounds of the Nortronics Research Park on the Palos Verdes Peninsula.

Mrs. Niki Spelous of Torrance will provide many of her Greek delicacies made from recipes she brought to this country from her native Athens 13 years ago.

When Mrs. Spelous lost her husband, she had four small children to raise — the youngest was a month old and the oldest was 7. She turned to what she did best, cooking. It is Greek custom to provide a dowry for marriageable daughters, and perhaps this fact (she has three daughters and a son) prompted her to come to the United States. She operated a Greek restaurant in the area until three years ago when the serious illness of her mother caused her to give it up.

HER CHILDREN are all grown now and two are married, but Mrs. Spelous is still cooking. She supplies several area restaurants with her delicacies and also does catering.

Some of her menu items will be Pasticio, a hot dish of macaroni cream, meat and cheese (sort of a Greek lasagna); Dolmades, grape leaves with rice, onions, mint and spices; Espanikopita, a spinach pie made with fresh spinach, onion, eggs, two kinds of cheese and pastry dough. Among the many desserts will be Baklava, a Greek-Turkish-Armenian-Jewish dessert of paper-

thick pastry in layers with honey; yoghurt cake and Greek cookies.

Besides food and drink items of all kinds, the Festival also features artists and craftsmen working at their specialties, ethnic folk dancing, a businessmen's band led by famed orchestra leader Stan Kenton, an art auction and displays from several leading La Cienega art galleries.

UNDER THE direction of professional artists, children will participate in artistic endeavors of all kinds. Last year over 3,000 art projects were completed. High schools and colleges will exhibit arts and crafts and cartoons by Paul Conrad and Interlandi will be displayed. There should truly be something of interest to everyone at this year's Festival.

Mrs. Robert Coors is chairman of the Festival, and Mrs. Lawrence Bayer is president of the Palos Verdes Community Arts Association. Festival grounds will be open from 11 a.m. until 6 p.m. Proceeds from the festival will go toward the building of a cultural center in Palos Verdes. Last year more than 10,000 people attended the Festival, and 15,000 are anticipated this year.
