## Withdrawal of Supreme Court Nominee Hailed

Joe Blatchford has pointed to the withdrawal of Abe Fortas for Chief Justice of the Supreme Court as "a great example of what the right man with the right cause can accomplish."

Speaking at the meeting of the 17th District Federation of Republican Women, Wednesday, Blatchford also said he hopes President Johnson will "quit playing games with the Senate and the American people and leave the decision on the next chief justice of the Supreme Court up to the new President."

Blatchford, Republican candidate for Congress from the 17th Congressional District, singled out Sen. Robert Griffith (R-Mich.) for "hard work against seemingly insurmountable odds."

"WHEN HE started his fight to let the next President name the chief justice, his only allies were a few Southern senators who had argued he would rather had not been raised," Blatchford explained.

"But as he continued his fight he slowly gained to his side more and more of the responsible Senate voices, including Sen. Dirksen, and this one man from Michigan was able to hold the line against the President of the United States and his powerful Congressional friends."

Blatchford said that although he considered the en-

# Arguments Mailed For Tax Proposal

SACRAMENTO — Ballot arguments for and against Proposition 1A on the Nov. 5 general election ballot, some nine million of them, are now in the process of distribution by Secretary of State Frank M. Jordan.

The proposed constitutional amendment, which is the legislature's answer to Proposition 9 on the same ballot, is the much discussed form of property tax relief proposed as a substitute for Proposition 9.

If both pass, the one receiving the most votes becomes a part of the state constitution.

**BRIEFLY,** Proposition 1A provides as follows, according to the argument written by Speaker of the House Jesse M. Unruh, with Senators George Miller and Nicholas Petris, authored the measure:

- For the current fiscal year, each homeowner will receive a direct cash payment of \$70 for property tax relief.

- For succeeding years, each homeowner will receive and exemption of \$750 in assessed valuation from property taxes on his home.

- Renters will have their standard state income tax exemption doubled, from \$500 to \$1,000 for single persons and from \$1,000 to \$2,000 for married couples.

- The property tax on household belongings will be totally eliminated.

- Businessmen will receive a 15 per cent reduction in their business inventory taxes.

**SPEAKER UNRUH** says that "no new taxes will be

needed to finance these tax reductions, as the program will be financed totally from existing state revenues. And there will be no loss of revenue to local governments, as the state reimburses such local governments for the tax reductions.

Arguments in favor of the measure also are written by Senator Miller and Petris, who say:

"Proposition 1A will preserve the independence of local government. It will be reimbursed, without strings attached or restrictions, for the tax reductions received. Other relief plans (Proposition 9) advanced supposedly to help you, would create fiscal chaos and cripple local government.

"They would give 70 per cent of the property tax relief to business and necessitate a drastic increase in state taxes (sales and income)."

contends that 1A proposes to tax thousands of non-property owners who do not pay a state income tax an additional half-cent sales tax, even though these non-property owners get no benefits.

He holds this is wrong, as no part of the society should be taxed solely to benefit another segment, and holds that this is particularly true when those so taxed are in the low and moderate income bracket and have less means than those who get the sole benefit from taxes so paid.

"The proposition proposes to approve the concept of taxation without equal benefits, which is a concept as bad as taxation without representation."
