

# Public Hearings Slated On Recreation Tax Issue

"Sportsmen, outdoorsmen, fishermen and other recreation enthusiasts will be crawling over each other for a glimpse of greenery or a breath of ocean air by the year 2020, when the 1964 California population of 18 million people triples, unless dependable, guaranteed, financing is provided on a continuing basis to enable orderly, long-range planning processes for the acquisition and development of recreation areas by all levels of government as well as private enterprise."

This was the warning issued today by 67th District Assemblyman L. E. (Larry) Townsend, a member of the Assembly Committee on Natural Resources, Planning and Public Works. The committee will conduct full hearings in Los Angeles Oct. 17 and 18 on its proposed \$50 million California Local Recreation Fund legislation. The Museum of Science and Industry, 700 State Drive, Exposition Park, will be the scene of the hearings.

"ALTHOUGH the major demand for outdoor recreation opportunities is in and near the large urban areas, the increasing leisure, mobility and disposable income of our exploding population, in the broader context, clearly makes this a statewide problem," Townsend said.

Specifically, the two-day hearings seek to establish dollar/acreage deficiencies

(Continued from Page C-1) North Vietnam to reciprocate in good faith to further bombing halts over its territory. Pressure tactics and a show of force, Blatchford says, will do more to expedite negotiations.

These tactics include threatening to mine Hanoi Harbor and training guerrillas to carry the war into North Vietnam. The United States should not necessarily do these things, Blatchford explains, but should use them as options at the bargaining table.

THE CANDIDATE also thinks the United States should cut off trade with all nations who support the Viet Cong. He takes a dim view of liberalized relations with Russia.

Blatchford believes another key issue in his campaign is the competency of his opponent, Democrat Glen Anderson. Blatchford reminded voters that Anderson was lieutenant governor during the Watts Riots and "could not make a decision" about what to do until the riots had risen to "unbelievable proportions."

"We need men who can make decisions," Blatchford insisted, pointing out that the McCone Commission report on the Watts Riots placed much of the blame for death and destruction on Anderson's indecisiveness.

BLATCHFORD predicts a Republican sweep in 1968. Remembering that Lt. Gov. Bob Finch "slaughtered" Anderson in the 17th District when the two were running for the state's second highest job in 1966, Blatchford believes he'll win handily over Anderson in November.

Blatchford has shown leadership ability since school days. Originally from Wisconsin, the candidate is an honor graduate of Beverly Hills High School. Going on to receive his degree in political science from UCLA, Blatchford studied law at UC Berkeley, where he was president of his first year law class.

AT UCLA, he was captain of the Varsity Tennis Team, and later played at Wimbledon in 1957.

Before entering law school, Blatchford served as administrative assistant to a New York Congressman in Washington, D.C.

Now settled in San Pedro, Blatchford is married to the former Winifred Marich, whom he met while she was an ACCION volunteer. Mrs. Blatchford received her degree in Spanish with honors from UCLA and has taught at South High School. She is also fluent in Portuguese and Serbo-Croatian.

in Southern California outdoor recreation and to capture public and local governmental reaction to funding innovations contained in a bill by committee chairman Edwin L. Z'berg which creates the local recreation

fund to receive annual revenues amounting to some \$51,100,000 for the first year. REVENUES accruing to the fund would be derived from three recreation-oriented sources:

- A 3.5 per cent tax on gross receipts from the sale of motor vehicle fuel, excluding commercial vehicles from June 1, through Sept. 30, of each year (\$23,100,000);
- An excise tax, not to exceed 1 cent for each 10

cents of the amount in excess of \$1 on the admission price to the professional spectator sports of baseball, football, basketball, ice hockey, golf, tennis, soccer, auto racing, and rodeo (\$3,000,000); and

- A 1 per cent tax on gross receipts from the sale of outdoor recreation sporting goods and equipment, excluding wearing apparel, related to fishing, hunting, etc. (\$25,000,000).

THE FUND would be 100

per cent available for grants to cities, counties, and recreation and park districts on the basis of \$1.30 per capita the first year in a matching-fund program. Z'berg's bill received strong support from cities, counties and recreation districts as well as the League of California Cities and the County Supervisors Association during the 1968 session of the legislature and is scheduled for re-introduction during the 1969 session. "The methods recommended to produce revenues for the recreation fund would ease the burden on local city and county general funds which are derived from property taxes
