


Rep. King Endorses Anderson

Former Lt. Governor Glenn Anderson has received the endorsement of veteran Congressman Cecil King at a dinner honoring Congressman King and Anderson. Anderson is seeking the Congressional seat in the 17th District being vacated by King. King served as Congressman for 26 years.

Anti-Los Angeles Views Got Thomas Into Office

Assemblyman Vincent Thomas, who has served the 68th Assembly District 28 years in the legislature and is seeking another term, told a San Pedro Chamber of Commerce luncheon last week of his introduction to politics.

Speaking at San Pedro Hacienda, Thomas said he got into politics after he had failed his bar examination. It was 1940 and he was one in a field of 10 candidates, given little chance of coming near the top in the polls.

"But I think I drew blood when at a meeting I was asked what I was for and I said I was against Los Angeles," he quipped.

Since that time Thomas

has had only token opposition. He briefly recounted some of the high points of his career:

Construction of the Vincent Thomas Bridge linking the San Pedro mainland with Terminal Island was the culmination of a 1940 promise. With opening of the Gerald Desmond bridge between Long Beach and Terminal Island it completes a round trip freeway circuit from civic center to the harbor area and back, via the Harbor Freeway, the two bridges and Long Beach Freeway.

Fuel tax for ships bunkering in port here was repealed; \$125,000 has been appropriated of the Drum Bar-


racks in Wilmington as a state and national monument and completion of the Harbor Freeway is due in 1970.

Bids Called For Artesia Freeway Work

The State Division of Highways has issued a call for bids for construction of a 3.1-mile section of the Artesia Freeway.

The project, scheduled between Atlantic Boulevard and Lakewood Boulevard, will cost an estimated \$8.7 million.

Bids are to be opened Dec. 19 in Los Angeles.




