

Torrance Library Adds To Children's Collection

Christmas Workshops Schedules

Torrance residents who would like to create their own Christmas decorations may register now for the 13th annual Christmas Workshop at the Joslyn Center.

The holiday workshop classes, sponsored by the Torrance Recreation Department, will be taught at three locations. Students will learn new craft ideas for making ornaments, candles, wreaths, and door decorations for the Christmas holidays.

McMaster Park, 3624 W. Artesia will conduct the workshop from Dec. 3 through 5 from 7:30 until 9:30 p.m. Workshop classes will be held at the El Retiro Park Rotary Building, 126 Vista del Parque, from Dec. 9 to 11 from 9:30 until 11 a.m.

AN OPEN house and reception will be held Dec. 2 at the Joslyn Center for students who have enrolled in the workshop classes. Christmas decoration samples will be on display from 9:30 to 11:30 a.m. and from 7:30 until 9:30 p.m.

The Torrance Hometown Singers, directed by Walt Wittel, will provide entertainment during open house and reception.

The registration fee for the classes is \$1. Students must buy materials for the decorations.

(Editor's Note: Nov. 17 through 23 is National Children's Book Week. The follow capsule reviews of children's books has been prepared by the Torrance City Library. These books represent the newest additions to the children's book collection.)

"The Treasure of the Turkish Pasha" by Yehoash Biber. This exciting tale of a search for hidden treasure is set in Palestine during the 1930s. The suspense and excitement mount as the group journeys through the treacherous Palestinian terrain to the middle of the Sinai desert — where the final clue is hidden. Ages 10-14.

"Hackberry Jones, Split End" by Curtis Bishop. Packed with action, this novel is filled with the excitement of the high school

varsity's fight for the championship and the conflict between quarterback Jim Carter and Hackberry Jones, the cowhand who could dodge any tackler on the field. Ages 12-14.

"Mystery in Marrakech" by Betty Cavanna. An intriguing suspense story about the kidnapping of an American girl and a desperate chase across the exotic Moroccan countryside to find her. Ages 12 and up.

"A Sunflower as Big as the Sun" by Shan Ellentuck. A nonsense tale, by a capable author-illustrator, about Uncle Vanya and just how big his sunflower really got. Ages 5-8.

"Grabianski's Dogs" by Janusz Grabianski. Full color illustrations of all kinds of dogs—some here at home and some from far away places. Ages 4-8.

"Jim Starling and the Col-

onel" by E. W. Hildick. "The youth of today is soft, pampered," declares Colonel Split - Statham, and Jim Starling is determined to prove he's wrong. An exciting adventure story which captures the world of the English schoolboy. Ages 10-14.

"The Wild Whirlwind" by Dahlov Ipcar. Gay four-color picture book with a clever story about Mr. Red — who had everything on his farm

matching his name, until the day of the wild whirlwind. Ages 4-7.

"The Scroobious Pip" by Edward Lear. The nonsense of Edward Lear, completed by Ogden Nash, emerges with style in Nancy Ekholm Burkert's brilliant illustrations. Ages 8 and up.

"Indian Summer" by Ferdinand Monjo. An "I Can Read" book deals with a pioneer family in Kentucky during the American Revolu-

tion. After corn harvest the Indians go on the warpath. Pa's away fighting with General Washington; but Ma and the four children smoke out an Indian from their own chimney. Ages 4-8.

"No End of Nonsense" by Jack Prelutsky. What child can resist this invitation to discover the surprises hidden in the pictures and ride with the whimsical nonsense of the poems? Four - color

pictures by Wilfried Blecher. Ages 4-8.

"The Iron Doors Between" by James L. Summers. A kindly, middle-aged couple take into their home Vic, a reform school parolee, who shatters their quiet lives.

Good realistic picture of the workings of a juvenile court, a dedicated parole officer and the rebellious, undirected young man. Ages 13 and up.
