A. The only way I know to get there is by Greyhound local. Check with the Greyhound office nearest you.

A. The 114 line was recently extended to serve the college. You can reach line 114 from Watts on the 33 or 100 lines. I'll send you timetables of all lines mentioned.

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# Lytton Art Exhibit Opens At Dominguez Hills State

In its first public presentation of the year, the California State College, Dominguez Hills, will display 23 major works of the million dollar Lytton Collection. The exhibit opened Monday evening, Dec. 2, in the Theater Upstairs.

The Lytton Collection, usually adorning the walls and lobbies of the modern, statewide Lytton offices, has been adjudged the most significant and complete cross-section of California contemporary painting and sculpture ever assembled by a private corporation.

IN AN enthusiastic advance review of the Lytton show, Andreas S. Anderson, Director of the Otis Art Institute, states: "These works constitute a highly significant exhibition of California art, furnishing a rare opportunity to see and appreciate its historic relevance to and, in many instances, its leadership in American art."

California artists represented in the show are: Clinton Adams, George Baker, George Ball, Bruce Beasley, Karl Benjamin, Tom Browne, Lorsa Feitelson, Keith Finch, Robert Hansen, James Jarvaise, John Paul Jones, Gerd Koch, Roger Kuntz, Helen Lundeberg, Stanton MacDonald-Wright, William Morehouse, Nathan Oliveira, Bernard Rosenthal, Walter Snelgrove, James Weeks, Bryan Wilson, Paul Woner, and Jack Zajac.

ANDERSON observed that the California painting on exhibition ranges "through most of the varieties of abstraction, hard edge to expressionistic; to the latest concern for and return to landscape, still life, anthropomorphic and biomorphic forms, and the human figure. Painting techniques vary in medium from oil to acrylic and collage, and in application from smooth to heavy brush strokes, knife painting and splatter, from thin to heavily built-up impasto. Sculpture is high in quality, with excellent examples of carving and of welded and cast metal."

Admission is free. Hours are from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. from Dec. 2-22 except Saturdays and Sundays.
