## NEW at your Torrance Library

"Shadow of Blooming Grove. Warren G. Harding in His Times," by Francis Russell: There's a song that has the first lines, "It ain't what you do, it's the way that you do it." Those memorable words are a proper epithet for this smacking good biography about one of our great white fathers. W. G. Harding was a country boy with the golden dream of success; politics was the way to achieve this goal. However, his skirt chasing, his inherent stupidity and some great reawakened news that a Negro has already made the White House are the ingredients of a must for history buffs and muckrakers.

"Send Down a Dove," by Charles MacHardy: The submarine war of World War II is recreated in this story of the HMS Scorpion, a British sub that is sent on a useless mission to the Norwegian fjords. The action is routine and the characters wooden, but here and there among the words a bit of interest does emerge — not really worth the effort.

"Salzburg Connection," by Helen MacInnes: Another cliff-hanger by a talented suspense, mystery writer of our era. This book has its background in the Austrian Alps during the final days of the Nazi period of Germany. There is much loot, much murder and just a dash of romance to keep the pot boiling. Good armchair for everyone.

"Memoirs of a Bullfighter," by Conchito Cintron: Seniorita Cintron recalls 20 years of bullfighting from Peru to Spain. She acquaints the reader with all the greats and the less-than-greats of this noble sport.

"Sinatra," by Arnolt Shaw: Francis Albert, the "Voice," is finally exposed to public view in this engaging biography of America's answer to Caruso — or is it Don Juan?

"Poverty Is Where the Money Is," by Shirley Scheibla: The reader is invited to take a critical look at the government's War on Poverty program through the observations of this book. Her views and observations may not be popular, but they are certainly worthy of review.

"A Song of Ascents," by E. Stanley Jones: E. Stanley Jones has been regarded as one of the greatest men in modern missionary life. He has written 24 previous books, all of which have been translated into 18 foreign languages; a truly remarkable Christian and a personally wonderful man.

"Squadron Shilling," by Arch Whitehouse: World War I: the Camels, the Sopwiths, the Bristol; Rickenbacker, Von Richtofen and all the golden gladiators of the air are involved in this novel of the last fling of knights who went out to battle the dragon and redeem the honor of the fair damsel.

"Appointment on the Moon," by Richard S. Lewis: From World War II through the Mercury and Gemini space flights, the reader is engaged in this story of America's space venture. A truly adventurous report of America's successes — and failures — in space flight.




