Sea Show Schedule Changed

Marineland of the Pacific this week began its winter schedule of sea shows at the Palos Verdes oceanarium.

The oceanarium is open every day from 10 a.m. to sunset, with the first series of shows beginning at 10:30 a.m., according to William F. Monahan, Marineland president.

"With the addition of the new killer whale show, we have moved up our entire schedule in order to get in four complete sets of shows daily," he said.

Monahan pointed out that each set contains, in addition to the killer whale show, dolphin games, seal circus, divers feeding 4,000 fishes in the depths of the world's largest fishbowl, and the Top Deck Whale Show starring Bubbles the pilot whale and Marineland's famous high-flying dolphins.

The killer whale show stars Orky, a 4,200-pound black and white animal which does a variety of tricks and routines in a 1,300-seat stadium pool. Two other killer whales are being trained presently to participate in the show.

Bobo was promoted to a position with the GT&E Data Service Corp., in Tampa, Fla., which, like General of California, is a subsidiary of General Telephone and Electronics Corp.

Galyan brings to his present position 18 years of telephone experience, which began in the supply and transportation department. Applications Due Jan. 15 For Battle of the Bands

Young musicians, singers, and dancers who wish to perform at Hollywood Bowl have until Jan. 15 to enter Los Angeles County's 10th Annual Battle of the Bands. Finalists in five divisions — school dance bands, dance bands, combos, vocal groups, and vocal soloists — will have the "once in a lifetime" opportunity to demonstrate their talents on the world-famous stage under the stars, according to Supervisor Burton W. Chace.

The countywide musical competition, sponsored by the Los Angeles County Department of Parks and Recreation, offers teenagers an unique occasion for outdoor showcase, the supervisor said.

FROM MORE than 2000 young amateur and non-union entertainers who will probably participate in the 1969 talent-search, only 300 to 400 will survive auditions and preliminaries, he explained. Three finalists from each division will vie for top honors.

Area Man Attempts Suicide

In an apparent suicide attempt, a Torrance man shot himself through the left side of his chest at 3:50 a.m. Saturday, puncturing his left lung.

Reported in fair condition at Gardena Memorial Hospital, where he received emergency treatment, was Harry Poole, 47, of 3151 W. 168th St.

Poole's wife, Joyce, who found the victim sprawled on the living room couch, told police there was no apparent reason for the suicide attempt, although Poole previously had threatened suicide.

Police said Poole was conscious when they arrived, and admitted inflicting the wound.
