(Continued from Page 1) needed to improve existing facilities. The forthcoming election will not affect the tax rate "very much," Dr. Hull told the steering committee, because of the city's growing assessed valuation.

"DURING the \$9 million bond issue a few years back we told taxpayers that their tax rate would not go up for bonds; in fact, we hoped it would drop off, or level off. The tax rate was around 98 cents at that time; this year the tax rate is 7 cents. "Where assessed valuation is growing as fast as it is in Torrance, the bond retirement tax is constantly reducing even though we are continuing buildings and adding to bonds. What passage of a bond issue would mean, would be that the tax rate for bonds and interest will be reducing at a somewhat lower rate if present trends continue," Dr. Hull concluded.

The committee has set its next meeting for Thursday, Jan. 9, at 3:45 p.m. at the school district's Educational Materials Building.

(Continued from Page 1) this country use .38-caliber guns. "If our men want to carry a more powerful firearm," he said, "all they have to do is ask."

IN FURTHER action, the council voted 6-0 to file a resolution from the Planning Commission calling for masonry walls around all city oil well sites. Only chain link fences are currently required.

Councilman Orin Johnson said it would be going "too far" to require masonry walls for all wells, since the expense would be prohibitive.

The Planning Commission resolution stated that any wall of "lesser substance" than decorative masonry defeated the purpose of an oil well beautification ordinance.

Mayor Isen charged that certain city commissions were trying to take over and "act as the City Council."

"We still establish policy," he said.
