Narcotics Program Launched

Supervisor Kenneth Hahn today announced approval of a unique Narcotics Information Project for Southwest Los Angeles. The pilot narcotics project suggested by Hahn, calls for specially trained 18-and 19-year-olds to work directly with parents, faculty, and students in the fields of the prevention of the use of narcotics and dangerous drugs, and rehabilitation.

"We must use every resource available to stop the narcotic traffic to school children," Hahn said. "This program will utilize the important influence of peer groups through the employment of young adults, some of whom have had drug experience."

These young people, recruited through the Manpower Division of the county's Personnel Department, will use the Concentrated Employment Program or the Neighborhood Youth Corps Program as a funding source, he said. They will be given intensive orientation and training before working with the students of Dorsey, Fremont, Jefferson, Jordan, and Gardena High Schools.

They will have an office in the South Los Angeles area, which will act as a Resource and Information Center. Working in close cooperation with the Department of Community Services in implementing the program will be various other agencies such as the County Commission on Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs, probation, law enforcement, schools, health, and mental health, all of whom will be directly involved in the recruitment, training and monitoring of the program.




