Taxpayers Ask IRS Ask Your Employer About Late Wage Report Forms

This column of questions and answers on federal tax matters is provided by the local office of the U.S. Internal Revenue Service and is published as a public service to taxpayers. The column answers questions most frequently asked by taxpayers.

My boss still hasn't given me a W-2 statement. What should I do?

Employers are required to issue withholding statements to their employees by Jan. 31, so it would be advisable to ask your employer about it.

I received a package of estimated tax forms in the mail. Does that mean I have to fill one out and send it in?

You do not have to file an estimated return for 1969 unless you meet the requirements as explained in the instructions that came with the estimated forms.

Estimated tax forms have been sent to every taxpayer who filed an estimated return for

1968 as well as to those taxpayers who had a balance due of \$40 or more than they filed their 1967 return. The forms are identified with the taxpayer's name, address, and social security number just as they appear in IRS files.

If you are required to file an estimated return, be sure to use the forms sent you. It will assure that your estimated tax payments are properly credited to your account.

Can I deduct the assessment I had to pay for a new sidewalk?

No, the law generally does not permit deductions for assessments for local benefits that tend to increase the value of your property.

Where can I get a copy of "Your Federal Income Tax?"

Torrance Boulevard

Utility Wires To Be Buried

Utility Wires on Torrance Boulevard from Madrona to Anza Avenue will be placed underground.

City Councilmen voted 5-0 Tuesday in favor of using the money accumulated in the underground utility fund for undergrounding utilities in the Torrance Boulevard area.

Councilman Jay Beasley was absent from the meeting due to illness, and Councilman Donald E. Wilson was unable to attend because of business obligations.

In Torrance, the Southern California Edison Co. set aside \$124,000 for 1968 and \$126,000 for 1969. The two telephone companies will match foot for foot whatever the power company undergrounds.

A public hearing on the matter of the Torrance Boulevard undergrounding will be held Tuesday, Mar. 25, at 7 p.m. The city clerk has been charged with notifying all property owners in the affected area.

Sen. Dills Appointed To Confab

State Senator Ralph C. Dills (D-San Pedro) has returned from Indianapolis where he attended a meeting of the National Society of State Legislators.

The 32nd District Senator was recently appointed by Senate President Pro Tempore Hugh M. Burns as one of two members of the upper house to serve on the Joint Legislative Committee on Legislative Organization in connection with work of the National Conference of Legislative Leaders.

Other members of the California Legislature serving on the National Conference include, in addition to Dills and Burns, the Speaker and Speaker Pro Tempore, the Majority and Minority leaders of the Assembly, and the chairman of the Assembly Committee on Rules.

Hahn Urges Open Parks On Sunday

Supervisor Kenneth Hahn has urged area school districts to keep playgrounds open on Saturdays and Sundays to give children safe places to play near their homes.

Schools should provide trained recreation personnel at all playgrounds for the weekends and should have planned play programs, Hahn believes.

"College and university students — especially physical education majors — also might be interested in providing supervision," Hahn said.
