**'Old Vic'  
Director  
To Speak**

Sir Tyrone Guthrie, who has directed more than 200 plays and 11 Broadway productions, will lecture in the El Camino College auditorium March 19, at 8 p.m.

Guthrie is currently directing Barrie Stavis' "Lamp at Midnight," a drama concerning the life of the Italian astronomer, Galileo Galilei. The production is now making its pre-Broadway tour of the United States, and will be performed in the ECC auditorium March 21.

For many years, Guthrie was director at the "Old Vic" in London. He was first artistic director of the Shakespeare Festival in Stratford, Ontario, Canada, where he presented several Shakespearean plays and Gilbert and Sullivan musicals.

In 1962, Guthrie was knighted by Queen Elizabeth in recognition of his contributions to the theater.

His current residence is in Ireland where he serves as chancellor of Queen's University.

**Gunpoint
