COUNCILMEN

agreed to let West determine where the cuts would be made, suggesting that custodial services might be subject to decreases. West said he would try to save money deferring the hiring of some library staff members, including custodians, until the library is actually open. He had hoped to hire his staff members in advance so that they would be pre-trained for their positions.

COUNCILMEN

will consider the library's regular operating budget today or tomorrow. Mrs. Louis Lanzer, president of the Torrance League of Women Voters, told councilmen that the League formally supported the work of the library. She urged councilmen to restore the book acquisition fund, which is depleted because an increased amount of library bond money was used to finance the construction of the central library.
