Teenage Art, a general art class is especially designed to introduce participants to different art activities. The fee for this class is \$3.

Summer Sessions Begin Tomorrow

Preliminary estimates indicate that nearly 22,000 students will attend summer classes in Torrance schools, according to Dr. J. H. Hull, superintendent. Included in this figure are 11,458 elementary school youngsters and 10,359 high school students.

The six-week summer school session will begin tomorrow and run through Wednesday, July 30. Classes will be offered at all elementary and high schools in the district. Students may register up to and including the first day of school.

Offered as a continuation of the regular year-round program, summer school will emphasize the academics. Academically talented seventh graders and all graduating eighth graders will be given the opportunity to take two high school courses from a selection of 23 offerings. High school students will have 139 courses to choose from.

Elementary classes will offer students a chance to study the regular courses more fully. Top students will be able to delve deeper into various subjects, while slower students will get help in subjects in which they need it, according to Dr. Lloyd Jones, assistant superintendent, elementary education.

Special classes in remedial reading and classes for academically talented and handicapped youngsters are also scheduled.

Enrollment in summer school is limited to students who live in Torrance. This includes students who attend private or parochial schools during the regular school year.

Chemistry Student Honored

Southern California Section of the American Chemical Society has announced that South High senior Frank E. Hanson has placed sixth in its 55th Annual High School Chemistry Contest.

A cash award of \$100 was presented to Hanson for his high score which ranked between the 95th and 99th percentiles. In competition were 582 Southern California students representing 76 high schools.

PHOTO 51, a two-unit course in elementary photography, satisfies the photography requirement for majors in journalism, art, police science, and industrial arts at El Camino.

The class will meet Wednesdays from 3:30 to 4:50 p.m. and Tuesdays from 3:30 to 4:20 p.m. Laboratory hours are Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday from 1 to 3:20 p.m.

PHOTOGRAPHY 1, Basic Photography, is primarily designed for students who wish to major in photography or who plan to continue with other advanced courses in photography.

The class will meet Mondays and Tuesdays from 8:30 to 10:20 p.m. and Wednesday from 8:30 to 9:20 p.m. Laboratory hours are Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday from 6 to 8:20 p.m.
