Librarians there urge anyone with material of possible historical interest, especially old newspapers and magazines, to get in touch with them.

Historical Data Sought by College

Harbor College is starting a search for treasure, buried or otherwise.

The treasure consists of historical documents relating to the Harbor area that might be gathering dust and deteriorating on local shelves and in local attics. The searchers are members of the college library staff assisted by members of the history department.

The librarians are attempting to establish a historical collection of materials having to do with the Harbor area, in-

cluding Palos Verdes, San Pedro, Wilmington, Terminal Island, Lomita and Harbor City.

MATERIAL for the collection could consist of documents, diaries, papers, photographs, maps and records. Street maps, brochures, real estate advertisements or advertisements of other businesses would be of special value to the library staff.

It is important according to librarians Pamela Bleich and Camille Baxter that a research collection and reference file of this material be made available to the public. It is also important that the handling and storage of the material be done by qualified personnel.

ALREADY files of local newspaper, bound volumes of early magazines with stories of the Harbor, and some pictures have been contributed by

individuals and groups in the area. The library eagerly awaits more.

Larry Frank, history instructor, also stressed the importance of oral history. "I feel that oral history should be a part of this collection, and that we should begin to put on tape interviews with people who have lived here for many years, and whose families have lived here for generations."

LIBRARIANS and instructors in California history will maintain supervision with the assistance of Camille Baxter, library coordinator, and Carlos Rico, campus illustrator.

Stressing the importance of the collection to anyone interested in local history as well as students in the school, Zorotovich said. "There is undoubtedly a tremendous amount of material in the Harbor area, if we can persuade people to get it out of attics and storage rooms, and send it to us."


