

Jessica Johnson To Talk

Having just returned from South Vietnam, Mrs. Jessica Johnson, World Vision's National Viet Kit Coordinator will speak at South Bay Church of God (meeting in Faith Wing), located at 17861 Yukon Ave.

Time of the meeting is set for 7:30 p.m., Monday.

While in the Orient, Mrs. Johnson also inspected other World Vision projects in Japan, Korea, Taiwan, Hong Kong, Thailand, Singapore, and Indonesia.

She was touring Vietnam at a time when few women were entering the country, between the Tet offensive and the later Saigon uprisings. She met Madame Thieu, wife of the president, and visited both military and civilian hospitals in the company of Madame Le, widow of a former top-ranking general.

In Japan, she visited World Vision's Keswick Convention; in Korea, she spoke at the Young Nak Presbyterian Church, the largest Presbyterian Church in Asia; in Taiwan, she spoke at the famed Church of the Lepers; in Hong Kong, she visited the notorious Walled City in Kowloon and along the border of Mainland China, she inspected World Vision's roof-top schools.

World Vision International is a missionary service organization through which more than 26,000 children are sponsored in 19 countries. It channels regular aid to widows, lepers, and tuberculosis patients, conducts Pastors' Conferences in remote areas to strengthen the local church and sends emergency aid to all parts of the world.

Adventists Push Devices To Discourage Smoking

Seeing is believing when viewing one of two new gimmicks aimed at tearing people away from their "smokes." One is a "lung ashtray." Two physicians, Dr. W.R. Spence and Dr. Gordon Short of Salt Lake City, Utah, have developed the ashtray, now in circulation. Made of plastic the ashtray has a pair of miniature lungs mounted above its center. Smoke is filtered through one lung but not the other. After a few cigarettes the one lung shows discoloration, just as a smoker's lungs would, while the other remains clear.

L.E. Fletcher of the Central California Conference appeared on television in San Francisco and demonstrated the new ashtray. He was on camera for an hour and gave the conference phone number as a source of more information about the ashtray. For days the switchboard was flooded with calls.

The trays may be purchased from the Temperance Department of the General Conference, 6840 Eastern Ave., N.W., Washington, D.C. 20012, at \$3 each.

The Pacific Union office has given lung ash trays to 13 top TV personalities.

A six-inch plastic doll with removable lungs is still in the planning stage. After a demonstration to school children, the lungs can be removed and given to the children to take home.
