



Cities Accused of 'Dragging Feet' on Storm Drain Planning

Supervisor Kenneth Hahn has accused city governments of dragging their feet in helping start flood control projects. "The city of Los Angeles, for example, has submitted plans for only 63 per cent of its projects in the 1964 bond issue," Hahn said. "Several other cities are just as guilty." Hahn believes much of the recent flood damage would have been prevented if cities would have submitted plans for flood control projects. "AT THIS point, only 37 per cent of the \$275 million 1964 bond issue has been spent or committed," Hahn said. The flood control program has no chance of being completed during the time originally promised, Hahn added. The supervisor urged cities expedite their preparation of plans so that all projects can get under way. Progress on bond issue projects depends to a large degree on the time it takes cities to submit plans for their work. "SO FAR, plans for 8 per cent of 1964 bond issue projects have been received by the Flood Control District. Of those, 63 per cent are in various other stages toward being built, or have been constructed. Sixty-one of the 72 cities involved in the 1964 bond issue have completed plans for projects. Of the others, Burbank, has four projects, of which 62 per cent of the plans have been received; Glendale, 3 projects, 87 per cent; Long Beach, 9 projects, 40 per cent; Los Angeles, 46 projects, 63 per cent; Pasadena, 3 projects, 28 per cent; Santa Monica, 3 projects, 67 per cent; Torrance, 4 projects, 75 per cent; and the County, 32 projects, 95 per cent. Plans for all regular 1958 projects have been received. Work on the last of the 1958 projects will be completed this year. There were construction savings on regular 1958 projects which were allocated to other jobs beginning in 1964, Hahn said. WORK FOR 71 drains, at a cost of \$26 million, has been authorized. Plans for 90 per cent of the supplemental projects have been received and construction is underway or has been completed on 75 per cent of them.
