

Adventure Film Set April 25

A documentary film which has become almost a classic adventure will be presented by the Torrance Recreation Department in cooperation with the Los Angeles County Museum of Natural History.

"The Sky Above—The Mud Below" will be shown at 7:30 p.m. Friday, April 25, at the Joslyn Center. Admission is free.

In 1959 a French-Dutch expedition began a 1,000-mile trek through primitive, uncharted areas of New Guinea. Seven months later, only two members of the party had completed the trip. They survived the natural hazards of the land and encountered pygmies, headhunters and cannibals, some of whom were living as they did 7,000 years ago.

"The Sky Above—The Mud Below" is presented as a cultural service to the community by the Los Angeles County Museum of Natural History.


The cast includes 40 students at this time, however try-outs will continue through next Friday. Lawrence emphasizes that other talent on the campus possibly has been overlooked.
