

UROC Unit Will Meet Tomorrow

Area Republicans will hear a detailed Sacramento Report at 8 p.m. Thursday when Arnold (Neil) Nielsen, Gov. Ronald Reagan's Southern California field representative, addresses the Palos Verdes Republican Club, UROC.

The meeting will be in La Casita at Bullock's Fashion Square, Del Amo Center.

Also on the agenda is election of officers for the 1969-70 term and announcement of detailed plans for the club's April 18 installation banquet. Redondo Beach Councilman Robert Westfield is installation chairman and Gardena City Attorney Walter N. Anderson will be master of ceremonies.

At Thursday's meeting, Loris R. Sinanian, UROC Area Governor, will outline plans for a district meeting at 6 p.m., April 1 in Manhattan Beach. Election of area officers will be on the April 1 agenda.

George Richards, outgoing unit chairman, will preside at Thursday's meeting and will announce winners of the local UROC election. Richards also will appoint delegates and alternates to the UROC state convention in Fresno in June.

Apartment Units Near Completion

A 112-unit apartment complex at 20440 Anza Ave., one mile from the Del Amo Financial Center, is now nearing completion, according to developer Stephen Massman.

Financing for the \$900,000 complex was arranged with The Life Insurance Co. of Virginia through its correspondent, Wallace Moir Co. of Beverly Hills. Bank of America provided interim financing.

To include 100 one-bedroom units and 12 two-bedroom units, the complex features sauna baths, gymnasiums, television and card rooms, sun decks, and a swimming pool.

Organization Plan Set For Beach Department

County supervisors have approved the organizational structure of the newly formed Department of Beaches, Supervisor Burton W. Chace said today.

The action was taken by supervisors yesterday. The need for a Department of Beaches had been declared by supervisors in February on a motion by Supervisor Chace.

"The new department is being formed with the strictest economy in mind," Chace said. "I want beach needs to get the most attention possible at the lowest operating cost."

THERE WILL be 121½ positions budgeted for the Department of Beaches, only five of them new employees. Some 115½ workers will be transferred from the Department of Parks and Recreation.

The new employees include a

director of beaches, a staff assistant, and three secretarial-clerical workers," Chace said. "Even these are not actually new positions, since this work is being performed in the Parks and Recreation Department."

In forming the Department of beaches, supervisors made the operational date May 1, 1969. Funds were transferred to the new department from the Parks and Recreation budget.

AT THE same time, the board adopted amendments to the administrative code formally establishing the department. A beach ordinance which governs the beaches operated or owned by the county also was approved.

The County Civil Service Commission is expected to start the recruitment and testing processes for the director of

beaches and subordinate positions within a week.

"Formation of this department is an important step in improving our beach programs and giving our shoreline the vital attention it deserves," Chace said.

THE DEPARTMENT will serve county and state beaches along the 67-mile shoreline. The cities of Long Beach, Santa Monica, and Los Angeles will continue to operate their own beaches.

Chace predicted the department will give more specialized direction to the promotion, protection, and development of the county's beach areas.

"I am hopeful the director of beaches will be able to come up with some sound, realistic recommendations on county subsidies to cities which operate their own beach departments," Chace said.
