Teen Candy Stripers To Serve at Hospital

Memorial Hospital of Gardena is now accepting applications for its new Candy Striper program.

A Candy Striper is a teenage boy or girl willing to work at the hospital through the Department of Volunteer Service. Applicants must be 15 to 18 years of age and receive the consent of their parents.

The purpose of the program is to interest young people in medical careers and to provide them with the opportunity for meaningful community service. Certificates and pins are

awarded for regular service. Applicants must attend a three-hour orientation for the program, learning hospital ethics, methods of patient care, and general information.

Opening Car Doors in Traffic Against Law

"It is illegal to open the door of a vehicle on the traffic side unless it is safe to do so and can be done without interfering with traffic," Capt. W. R. Waldron of the California Highway Patrol warned today.

Each year many accidents occur because drivers open their doors into moving traffic without looking, the Patrol commander said.

"These accidents mostly result in property damage only, but they can be pretty costly, el-

ther directly or indirectly, to the persons responsible for them."

The CHP official also noted that the vehicle code prohibits leaving a door open on the traffic side longer than is necessary, to load or unload passengers.
