Baptists to Aid Churches During Mexican Sojourn

Some 45 high school and college students from Torrance First Baptist Church and 20 adult sponsors will spend Holy Week in Sonora, Mexico. Purpose of the trip is to assist churches in the nearby Benjamin Hill area.

The group will leave Torrance tonight, making a rest stop at the First Baptist Church of Imperial, Calif. On Saturday, they will cross into Mexico at Nogales and travel south to Benjamin Hill, which will serve as their headquarters. The return trip will take them through San Luis, and they'll spend the night as guests of the First Baptist Church of Yuma, Ariz. The group will be back in Torrance, Saturday, April 5.

All persons participating have been attending a training and orientation series taught by Mr. and Mrs. Henry Manriquez from the Benjamin Hill area.

The young people will pay their own expenses, and have raised \$1,000 through car washes and other projects for donation to a Benjamin Hill church. The money will be used for the repair and expansion of a chicken ranch there. Supplying feed and baby chicks for the ranch has been a special project of the Torrance youth group for several years.

Supervising the trip is Barney Kinard, minister of youth. Other leaders are Richard McGinty, basketball team; Harry Matthews, baseball team; A. D. Rupe, food and transportation; Tom Irvine, music; the Rev. Lloyd Newlin, pastor; and John and Madeline Stanley, work team.

A teen folk singing group, The Burning Bush, will be performing each night at local auditoriums in the Benjamin Hill area.

'Right Use of Power' Is Palm Sunday Topic

The Palm Sunday worship service at the First Presbyterian Church of Gardena, 1957 Redondo Beach Blvd., will begin at 11 a.m. with child care provided for children under three. The Sunday Church School classes will be on regular schedule at 9:30 a.m. Palm Sunday,

but there will be no classes on Easter Sunday.

The Maundy Thursday Communion Service will be held on April 3 at 7:30 p.m. with the Chancel Choir presenting sacred music of the lenten season and also the short cantata, "The Seven Last Words of Christ" by Richard Weinhorst. The community is invited to attend. Child care will be provided.

Lutherans Observe Holy Week

The observances for Holy Week and Easter at First Lutheran Church in Torrance, have been prepared. Palm Sunday festivities will be observed at the regular three services Sunday at 8, 9:15, and 10:45 a.m. With this introduction to Holy Week the traditional services for Holy Thursday and Good Friday will follow.

Holy Thursday or Maundy Thursday has been observed as a service of "The Shadows" which will be a re-enactment of the Upper Room. The service will also include Holy Communion.

A 12-hour prayer vigil will begin on Good Friday at 7:30 a.m. It will conclude in the evening at 7:30 as the Good Friday service begins. The Chancel Choir of First Lutheran Church will present the Cantata, "To Calvary" with readings by the pastors. The choir is under the direction of Arthur Knudson.

On Easter Sunday, four worship services will be provided for worshippers. An early service at 6:30 a.m. is added to the usual three services each Sunday at 8, 9:15, and 10:45 a.m.

Youth Choir will sing "Lamb of God" and "Create in Me a Clean Heart." The Chancel Choir will sing the "Requiem" by Gabriel Faure, under the direction of William Reynolds; Janet Leigh Taylor, harpist; Charlotte Tierman, soprano soloist; Richard Harris, baritone.
