**Wilcox Finds Acceptance Among Thailand's People**

Less than a year ago, Joe Wilcox was the busy director of the Torrance Family YWCA. Today, Wilcox is putting his Torrance experience to work for the growing YMCA in Bangkok, Thailand. Joe Wilcox is highly enthusiastic about the YMCA in Bangkok — especially the work of a branch in the heart of the ghetto district. Over 2,600 young people

crowd through the doors of this YMCA daily just to learn English . . . a stepping stone to better jobs. He is enthusiastic, too, about the Y's camp — the first of its kind in Thailand — which served many youngsters from deprived areas of the city.

But Wilcox finds one big difference — the scarcity of organization dealing with the situation. "In Thailand," he says, "the YMCA must play a leadership role in aiding the Thai people to understand and solve their problems. There is simply no comparable organization equipped to deal with them in Thailand."

ON THE LIGHTER side, Wilcox, of course, is finding much in Thailand that is new and fascinating. Recently, a group of young people introduced him to some of the Thai customs at a YMCA banquet in the ghetto area. He writes: "First of all, a wild band — composed of Y members — gaily paraded in, banging gongs, drums, and pieces of wood, and danced around with great exuberance. Behind the band came scores of girls, carrying the hottest seasoned food in the world, placing trays on the floor for us to eat. We ate with relish (actually with curry), gulping water in between each bite to overcome the heat."

"While we ate, Y members entertained the diners. They had candle dances, sword fights, torch-throwing contests, games, songs — and a beauty contest for "Miss Khon Tok." Following the dinner, strands of banana fiber were ceremoniously tied on the wrist of each person present symbolizing friendship and love."

**Drive Under Way For Scholarship**

A fund-raising drive is under way at El Camino College for the Martin Luther King Memorial Scholarship under the joint sponsorship of the Associated Students and the Academic Senate of the faculty. Contributions are being sought from students, faculty, and members of the community, according to Merl Sloan, vice president of student personnel and a member of the scholarship committee. The committee hopes to award the first scholarship late in the spring. Each award will be \$250 with the number of

scholarships given dependent upon the amount of funds available. "THE MARTIN Luther King Memorial Scholarship has been established to perpetuate the memory of Dr. King and to aid in the fulfillment of his hopes by helping and encouraging students who might not otherwise be able to further their education," Sloan stated.
