There are many things that can be done in designing a college summer session. Among them, one of the most important seems to me to be that of an honest effort to assist the communities' needs for continuing education.

The next thing a college must do to the best of its ability is respond to those interests. For example, in the 1969 summer session (June 23-Aug. 1), California State College, Dominguez Hills, will offer a variety of courses designed to accommodate the needs of many individuals. The following is a sampling of courses which will be offered by the School of Humanities and Fine Arts. I will delineate the offerings of other Schools in later columns.

Twentieth Century Artists: Their Writings and Their Art. Introduces the student to past and current directions in modern and contemporary art with an emphasis on developments that have occurred since the 1930s. Studies will be made of the materials, elements and compositional factors that are involved in the art of the 1950s and 1960s. Such avant-garde interests as site-sculpture, distributional sculpture, kinetics, Funk art, happenings and environments will be examined in the hope of establishing a critical framework for understanding the current aesthetic. Guided observation and analysis of original works will be conducted through visits to local galleries and museums.

Understanding Fiction. Analysis and discussion of selected masterpieces in the short story and the novel, including works by Joyce, Hardy, George Eliot, F. Scott Fitzgerald, Hemingway, Claude McKay, and Jean Toomer, a virtually unknown Black writer of considerable talent.

American Literature I. Intensive study of such American authors as Poe, Hawthorne, Melville, Mark Twain, Hemingway, Faulkner, Baldwin, and Leroy Jones. The course will focus upon the relevance of these works to the entire mainstream of American civilization. The established place of Afro-American writers in the course of American literature will be studied.

Contemporary Theater. This course attempts to accomplish a definition of contemporary theater by sampling it. Almost every kind of writer in the modern theater will be included: Ibsen, Chekov, O'Casey, O'Neill, Brecht, Giraudoux, and Sartre, as well as Camus, Beckett, Ionesco, Williams, Durrenmatt, Albee, and Bolt. All the playwrights will be studied at their provocative best in order to show the relationship of the dramatist to his time and also to see the history of man through the form of the drama.

Applied Linguistics. One of the primary purposes of this course is to better enable the student to handle the newer textbooks in English which make use of linguistic materials. It is hoped that this can be accomplished by providing the student with a better understanding of the linguistic concepts of phonology, morphology, syntax, and vocabulary. This course will handle many of the same linguistic concepts in terms of sound, form classes, function classes, and talk-music noises of the language we use.

Basic Studies Music. An introduction to the technique of listening to music. Covers a wide variety of music from all periods of history and deals with the elements of music, basic principles of continuity, and their realization in large structures.

American Music. Examination of selected works in American music from colonial times to the present. Concentrates on the emergence of several important styles and composers and deals substantially with the Negro contribution to American music. Teachers of choral music should find the course especially useful.

Twentieth Century Composers: Their Writings and Their Music. An interdisciplinary course examining some of the outstanding documents of 20th century composers (such as the books of Stravinsky, Schoenberg, Bartok, and Ives) to increase understanding of their ideas and music.

Philosophy in the Modern World. A behavioral science approach to the subject of philosophy. Philosophy, according

Public Schools Week Observance Planned

The 50th anniversary of Public Schools Week will be observed April 21 through 25 with most Southland schools participating by scheduling open-house programs for students and parents.

The annual observance has been sponsored by state Masons since the end of World War I when a critical shortage of teachers and public apathy threatened the public schools structure.

"We are heading toward a new historical era in our modern technological world," pointed out Henry C. Clausen, Deputy Grand Commander and Sovereign Grand Inspector General of Masons in California.

"CONTENDING or cooperating as we are with other nations of the world, we shall succeed in our goals by brain rather than brawn. Hence, through support of your public schools, you can help build a better America."

Robert A. Crigler of Los Angeles, Grand Master of Masons in California and Hawaii, called the public school "a bulwark of our democracy."

DR. VIERLING Kersey of

Los Angeles was a member of the first Public Schools Week committee organized at the end of World War I, and served for the next 35 years.

"The present trend to instability and lack of discipline in some of our youth will not be solved by more laws and social legislation, but will be resolved in our homes and our public schools," said Kersey, a former state chairman of public schools.

In the past half century, California has not only increased in population more than any other state but has paralleled this spectacular growth with an unsurpassed public schools education program starting

with kindergarten at one pole and including adult education at the other, he added.
