

Mini-Mart Held Up By Duo

Two El Camino College students were arrested for armed robbery Saturday night shortly after the 7-11 Market at 3737 W. 230th St. was held up.

Jailed were Robert Evans Mahler, 19, of 23209 S. Almaroso Ave., and William J. M. McIntyre, 18, of Manhattan Beach. They were arrested at 11 p.m. at the corner of 182nd Street and Crenshaw Boulevard, after Torrance police spotted them driving in a car which fit the description of the suspect vehicle.

The two were accused of entering the 7-11 Market about 10:30 p.m., pulling a gun on the manager, and forcing him to turn over the money in the safe and two cash registers. Sum of the cash taken was \$326.

Police said they found a paper bag containing the cash inside the suspect vehicle.
