

OFF TO CAMP . . . YMCA camping expeditions in the "good ol' days" were a far cry from today's ventures. Today, the YMCA offers one of the largest camping programs in Los Angeles, with 15 separate camp periods serving more than 1,500 youngsters. Camp sign-up day is Saturday, May 24. The "Y" celebrates its 125th anniversary this year, and marks its 85th year in organized camping.

Handicapped Workshops

Ten new workshops for the handicapped are opened each year in California because of the needs of the communities. The workshops depend on business and industry to supply the sub-contract work used to train the handicapped.

Handicap Workshop

More than 2,100 handicapped persons found full-time employment last year as a result of their training in California's workshops for the handicapped. The workshops provide jobs and training for more than 22,000 persons annually.

Red Cross Offering Jobs for Teenagers

Red Cross is offering Harbor area junior and senior high school students the opportunity to get involved in voluntary service to others through its summertime service program.

Youth who are interested in participating in the program will attend a volunteer orientation Wednesday, May 28 from 3:30 to 6 p.m. at the Red Cross Service Center, 1499 W. First St., San Pedro.

Service opportunities include work with handicapped children on day camp and other recreation programs at the Harlan Shoemaker School in San Pedro and the Spastic Children's Society in Gardena. Certified Red Cross lifesavers and water safety aides will assist with swimming programs.

At the Harbor Area Retarded Children's Foundation in San Pedro and the Gardena Valley Retarded Children's Home in Gardena student groups may work with six to 15-year-old mentally retarded children.

At County Health Centers in Torrance, San Pedro and Wilmington youth volunteers will work with children, and at Headstart sites in San Pedro and Wilmington they will assist teachers during story hour and supervise crafts and recreation.

At convalescent and nursing homes in San Pedro, Lomita, Gardena and Torrance students will write letters for patients, wheel patients about and assist with recreation programs.


OCALA, FLA., STAR-BANNER: "Does the wide disparity of welfare funds made available by the various states encourage would-be recipients to move from state to state seeking larger handouts? . . . Just the other day . . . (the New York City) welfare department denied welfare benefits to a woman with 12 children who had migrated from Mississippi. If her application had won approval, she would have received \$745 a month in welfare, tax free and not including free medical care available under the Medicaid program. Multiply that \$745 by 12 and it comes out to a cool \$8,940 in relief payments."

GRANDFIELD, OKLA., NEWS: "Although probably the major share of blame for the breakdown in our court system can be placed squarely on the legal profession and social do-gooders, much of it can also be blamed on citizens who fail to accept their responsibilities when called to jury duty and testifying in court."

PORTLAND, ORE., OREGONIAN: "Whether they like it or not, the country's college and university administrators are in the position of setting an example of law enforcement with justice. Their failure on any considerable scale would almost certainly subject other institutions to non-negotiable demands and physical intimidation. Under such circumstances, it would be suicidal to consider the issues on the campuses to be apart from the concern of all of us off campus or to bar from the campuses the lawful operations of state and community law enforcement agencies, when needed."
