

Permit Procedures to Be Revised by City Schools

Procedures are now being drafted to implement a new City Board of Education ruling to use "open enrollment" transfer permits to improve racial balance at Los Angeles elementary and secondary schools.

The new ruling, which makes ethnicity a primary factor in the granting of permits, was approved by the board in keeping with recently adopted state guidelines.

Superintendent of Schools Jack P. Crowther said staff members are now revising permit procedures to reflect the new ruling in the awarding of permits for the next school year.

Announcement concerning

the number of permits that will be available at city elementary and secondary schools next fall and the dates for application will be delayed until the new procedure is determined.

Former board policy on open enrollment, as stated in Board Rule 2051, holds that a "pupil

may be granted a permit to attend a school not within the area boundaries of his residence if there is sufficient reason to believe that both the pupil and the school system will be served thereby."

In carrying out this policy, school officials grant permits on the basis of "space available." The number of transfer

permits given at a school depends upon the unused capacity of that school.

Once the number of permits is determined and announced at the secondary level, a chance drawing is held at a predetermined time to give all applicants for permits an equal opportunity. Elementary school permits are granted on

a "first-come, first-served" basis.

Newly approved revisions to the policy ask that racial or ethnic factors also be taken into consideration on the premise that the interest of the schools are served by granting permits that tend to create an ethnic balance in each school.

The ruling states:

"Whenever a school has a preponderance of one racial or ethnic group, and has a number of openings to be filled by permit, those permits shall be offered first to those of a different racial or ethnic group in order to develop a balanced student body."

In addition, the ruling calls for "insured continuity of the broadest possible educational experience for pupils attending elementary and junior high

schools under any voluntary transfer program which contributes to a more racially balanced school."

It further asks that all permits be reviewed annually and that the data be reported to the board.

Medical permits, secondary curriculum permits and permits related to the Children's Center program would not be affected by the revisions.

Programs To Close Festival

As part of their class projects they have written in various forms such as three part inventions, songs, brass ensemble works, and string quartets. "The music is inventive and interesting," says Miss Ruth Anderson, music theory instructor.

Help for Seniors Scheduled

Senior citizens who need assistance in filing for property tax reimbursement under the Senior Citizens Property Tax Assistance Law may contact a representative of the Franchise Tax Board at the Albert Bartlett Center, 1318 Cravens, on Tuesday, May 27, only from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

The Senior Citizens Property Tax Assistance Law provides for a reimbursement of a portion of the property taxes paid by California residents who are 65 years of age or older, who own and reside in their own homes, who have paid the property taxes for the current year, and who have incomes of \$3,350 or less. Claims may be filed at any time prior to Oct. 15, 1969.
