

Oldest Californians Sought for Bicentennial

The California Bicentennial Celebration Commission today announced it wants to locate and honor the 200 oldest living Californians.

Lt. Gov. Ed Reinecke, chairman of the Bicentennial Commission, said that the search will continue for approximately two months. Applications will be accepted until July 23 by the commission, by County Bicentennial Committees, and by the California Commission on Aging, co-sponsors of the search.

Announcement of the names of the 200 oldest would be made about two weeks later, he indicated.

IN ADDITION to honoring the 200 oldest Californians, the Commission will make several special awards. Awards will go to the oldest living native son or daughter of California, regardless where he or she now lives. Supplementary awards, if necessary, will be made to

the oldest native son or daughter now resident in the state.

Awards will also be made to the oldest man and oldest woman now living in California, and resident here since before Jan. 1, 1969, regardless where they were born. A similar award will be made to the oldest man and woman resident in the state for 50 years or more.

THE BICENTENNIAL also will honor the longest married couple. To be eligible, at least one member of the couple must be a native Californian, they must have been residents of California for the past six months and for more than half of their married life.

The winners will be proclaimed as the Bicentennial Couple and invited to participate in a number of Bicentennial events.

"We expect," Lt. Gov. Reinecke noted, "that as word gets around the country there

will be numerous applications." In the event that there should turn out to be more than 200 Californians,

over the age of 100, the Commission will expand this program and recognize all California residents attaining the age

of 100 years between the time this competition closes in July and the end of the Bicentennial years, Dec. 31, 1970.

Scouts to Stage Big Show June 7

More than 15,000 Cub Scouts, Boy Scouts and Explorers will join with Scouts from throughout Los Angeles to participate in the 1969 Scout-O-Rama set for Saturday, June 7, reports Leslie N. Shaw, general chairman.

Open to the general public, the event will take place at three locations with local units participating at El Camino College from noon to 9 p.m. Purpose of the Scout-O-Rama, with the theme "A Country Fair" is to give the boys an opportunity to display skills, see other boys in action, broaden friendships, stimulate pride and provide activities.

Proceeds from the program will go to help provide funds for individual Scout units as well as add funds to the camping facility budget of the Los Angeles Area Council which is presenting the Scout-O-Rama.

EIGHT SHOWS will be provided at the event including one which will feature more than 650 booths displaying action-filled adventure of Scouting. Other activities include an Indian village, challenge arena, little theatre, pioneering area, and country fair kitchen. Pool Rules Listed for Residents

Swimming pool owners in the area were cautioned today by Red Cross that improper use of their pools could make them less enjoyable and even cause tragedy.

"As summer approaches this is the time to clean the debris out of the pool, have the purification system put in working order, and make sure there are safety devices at poolside," said Roger Plaisted, director of safety programs for the Los Angeles Chapter Red Cross.

- Be sure pool deck is as slip-proof as possible.
- Clearly mark with buoy lines with the shallow and deep parts of pool.
- Allow no one to swim alone.
- Fence the pool and include a gate which can be locked when pool is not in use.
- Consult your local health department about pool sanitation.
- Install a Home Pool Safety Post, with ring buoy, reaching pole, and list of emergency phone numbers.
- Keep a first aid kit on hand.
- Do not allow running or horseplay around pool.
- Do not allow bottles or glassware around pool.
- A diving board can be a hazard. Caution swimmers to stay away from the area directly in front of the board.
