

CHP Hikes Standards For Public Bus and Truck Tires

Safety regulations relating to the tread depth on tires used on public carrier buses and trucks became effective on an emergency basis May 22, rather than later this year as originally scheduled by the California Highway Patrol, Commissioner H. W. Sullivan announced today.

The highway patrol took the emergency action at the request of Sen. Walter W. Stern and Assemblyman Wil-

liam M. Ketchum, both of Bakersfield.

The legislators requested that the new regulations become immediately effective following a tragic charter bus accident May 10 on Interstate 5 near Castaic in which the bus went out of control, skidded across the divider strip, and went over a bank, killing three Girl Scouts, and injuring 20.

depth of less than 1/16 inch measured at any point on the tire on any bus wheel or on the front wheel of any truck subject to Motor Carrier Safety Regulations.

The previous prohibition against tires "which do not have clearly defined tread configuration" applied only to the front wheels of both buses and trucks.

The new regulations also prohibit the use of regrooved tires on the front wheels of regulated buses and trucks, except that certain tires designed for regrooving may be used on the front axles of vehicles used exclusively in urban and suburban areas.

THE NEW regulations prohibit use of a tire with a tread

THE PROHIBITION against use of recapped or retreaded tires on the front wheels of buses, which was contained in the old regulations, is extended in the revision to apply to regulated trucks as well.

The tire regulations adopted were developed during the past six months as part of a general revision of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations contained in the California Administrative Code.

Public hearings on the general revisions will be scheduled later this year prior to their adoption.

THE PROPOSED revisions, including the emergency tire regulations, were reviewed by the highway patrol's Advisory Committee on Motor Carrier Regulations, which includes representatives of the Highway Carriers Association, the California Bus Association, truckers, teamsters, the California Association of Publicly Owned Transit Systems, agricultural organizations, contractors, and others in the industry.

He will be in charge of sales promotional activities for the VAC organization throughout the country.

Shareholders Re-elect Lucky Stores Officers

Gerald A. Awes has been re-elected chairman of the board of Lucky Stores, Inc., at the firm's annual meeting of shareholders, held May 22 at corporate headquarters in San Leandro, Calif.

Awes was re-elected chairman and chief executive officer of the board after all directors had been re-elected by shareholders.

Three new vice presidents — E. F. Anderson, H. W. Kirby, and S. D. Ritchey — were elected. Other officers of the board were re-elected.

Shareholders approved a qualified stock option plan for key employees and authorized an increase in authorized capital to 35,000,000 common shares, 100,000 preferred shares with a par value of \$50 each, and 1,000,000 preference shares without par value.

A dividend of 35 cents was declared, payable June 1 to shareholders of record at the close of business June 15. The board also approved a two-for-one stock split effective Sept. 28 for shareholders of record Sept. 5.

Instructor To Teach in Singapore

Mario Garrolini, instructor in the tool design and manufacturing division at Harbor College, has been granted a one-year leave of absence from the college to teach in Singapore.

Garrolini volunteered his services to the International Labor Organization two years ago and was offered the teaching post in Singapore. The main goal of this United Nations-sponsored operation is to lower the rate of unemployment in underdeveloped countries. The school itself is like a training center, where trainees will be taught skills that will make them self-sufficient.

Garrolini's wife Piera, two sons and daughter, will accompany him to Singapore. The first leg of their trip will be in July, to Geneva, where Garrolini will receive three weeks of orientation. He and his family will then be flown to Singapore.

Siren Test Is Cancelled

No civil defense siren test will be held for the month of May because the customary test date falls on Memorial Day, a national holiday. Sheriff Peter J. Pitchess has announced.

The decision was made after the Los Angeles County and Cities Disaster and Civil Defense Commission had issued its usual news story announcing the scheduled test.
