CHAIN LETTER NUISANCE.

Most persons are familiar with what is called the chain letter, which is to be copied and mailed to a number of persons, with the warning of penalty for failure to comply.

Some of these chain letter schemes have been used for the collection of money, a dime being the usual sum asked of the recipient, some cause being named as the beneficiary.

The postoffice has long had a ban on the chain letter used for the collection of money, but it is often troubled with letters which promise blessing for sending it on to others.

The most common chain letters carry with them a hint of superstition—fear of the individual that trouble will follow failure to pass the message on.

The solicitor for the postoffice department has ruled that these chain letters come under the head of unmailable matter because of the threats which they contain.
