**VERMONT AVENUE BOOSTERS  
PUT NEW LIFE INTO  
THEIR PLANS**

Delegations From Number of Cities  
Meet At San Pedro Luncheon  
And Thrash Out Project

An important meeting of the Vermont Avenue Boulevard committees was held in San Pedro Friday at the Fifth Street Cafeteria, when a number of telling speeches were made, describing what the road means to this section of the State, as well as a means of saving the orange groves of Southern California. This was the message given from members of commercial societies of Torrance, Lomita, Harbor City and Gardena.

The luncheon was given to perfect an organization to boost for the improvement of Vermont Avenue from "The Mountains to the Sea." There were twenty-five representatives of the six cities present including some of the most prominent business men of the district. Capt. Louis Hansen presided.

M. G. Watkins of Athens, chairman of the boulevard project, stated that the improvement of Vermont Avenue from "The Mountains to the Sea," is really a belated affair, and that the boulevard should have been built long ago. It will be greatly needed before it can possibly be finished now, he said.

E. X. Andem of Torrance called attention to the fact that this boulevard will not be in any sense a competitor of any other road and it is needed strictly on its own merits. He added that all of the roads which have been mentioned will be needed and will be largely used the moment they are completed.

Other speakers gave great credit to those who had by their persistent efforts had pushed the project along so well thus far.

S. O. Barnes, president of the Gardena Chamber of Commerce, was the last speaker and said that "No city can grow without good roads. You people here in San Pedro are the ones who are most vitally interested but we want to help you get this road through, and we want you to help us." The road is needed and must be built, and will be if we camp right on the trail.

"Orange growers face ruin on account of freight rates," said C. J. Colden, of San Pedro. "The remedy is to ship by water."

The plan for the Vermont Avenue road is to follow the east side of the Pacific Electric line from Gardena through "Hammerton" and Harbor City, and connect with the Lomita Road at the junction of the Wilmington fork. Part of the road is in the city limits and part in the county.

**DID YOU GET YOUR LICENSE?**

Motorists must make application for their state licenses or 1921 within the present month—and, remember, this is a short month—and only a few days left; its end will soon be here. Motorists who are not carrying the yellow number-plates on March 1 will be subject to arrest and their fine will be equivalent to 25 per cent of their tax.

It is imperative that applications be made before the eve of February 28. In your application is in, you will be safe from apprehension and conviction, even though your application may not have been acted upon and the license-plates issued.

But you will be subject to detention and interrogation, and you must present the required proof of having made your application regularly and in good faith.

Make all applications to the State Motor Vehicle Department either at its main office in Sacramento or at its branch office in Los Angeles.
