ORDINANCE NO. 39

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE AMENDING AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE FIXING THE TIME AND PLACE FOR HOLDING REGULAR AND SPECIAL MEETINGS OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE," NUMBERED NO. 15, BY PROVIDING FOR THE CHANGE OF THE TIME OF MEETING OF SUCH BOARD, AND REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 24.

The Board of Trustees of the City of Torrance do ordain as follows:
SECTION 1.

Section 1 of an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance Fixing the time and place for holding regular and special meetings of the Board of Trustees of the City of Torrance," and numbered 15 is hereby amended to read as follows:

The Board of Trustees of the City of Torrance shall in each calendar month hold two regular meetings for the conduct of the business of said Board. Said meetings shall be held on the First and Third Tuesdays of each and every calendar month in the south room of that certain building, located on lot 3 block 1 of Torrance Tract in the City of Torrance, State of California, which room shall be known as the Council Chamber, and during the months of October to March, both inclusive, said meetings shall be called at seven o'clock P. M. and during the months of April to September inclusive said meetings shall be called at eight o'clock P. M. When any regular meeting falls on a holiday said regular meeting shall be held on the next succeeding business day thereafter. All Trustees' meetings shall hold until duly adjourned whether the same shall continue after twelve midnight or not.

SECTION 2

Ordinance No. 24 is hereby repealed.

SECTION 3

The City Clerk shall certify to the passage of this ordinance by a two-thirds vote of all the members of the Board of Trustees and shall cause the same to be published in the Torrance Herald, a weekly newspaper printed and published in the City of Torrance, and which is hereby designated for that purpose.

And thereupon and thereafter this ordinance shall be in full force and effect.


