

McCLELLAN IS NAMED STATE COMMISSIONER

Supervisor of 4th District Selected By Richardson

Governor-elect Friend W. Richardson announced today that he had selected the three new members of the state highway commission who will go into office with the new administration on January 8 next.

While he did not make known the names of the men he had chosen he declared: "I have selected three big men for state highway commissioners," adding that he felt these men had the road experience and the business ability necessary for directing the operations of highway construction in California.

The men whom, it is understood, the governor-elect has selected, are: Harvey Toy of San Francisco, Louis H. Everding of Eureka, and R. F. McClellan of Los Angeles.

McClellan is a member of the Los Angeles county board of supervisors, and is said to be well versed in highway matters.

Toy is a well known business man of the Bay District, is owner of the Hotel Manx, and is an enthusiast on highways. He was Richardson's manager in San Francisco during the campaign.

Everding is a retired business man of Humboldt county, who has taken a great interest in highway construction. He has toured the entire United States in his own automobile.

R. M. Morton, highway engineer of San Diego, has been selected for state engineer and director of the state department of public works by Governor-elect Richardson, according to information received from reliable sources today.

Morton will succeed A. B. Fletcher, who has been state engineer for nearly eleven years, and who receives \$10,000 a year. It became known recently that Richardson had visited San Francisco and Los An-



INCOME TAX DOPE

Income tax receipts from the December drive for the payment of the fourth and final installment will amount to \$6,428,261.81. Collector of Internal Revenue Rex Goodcell announced recently.

Income tax collections for the country as a whole have shown a decrease of 30 per cent, while the Los Angeles district's shrinkage in December receipts was only 11 per cent, which is less than the reductions in tax provided for by the new revenue act. This again puts Los Angeles at the head of the sixty-four internal revenue districts.

For the calendar year ending December 31 income tax receipts will reach \$33,717,826.11, as compared with \$35,821,215 reported for the last fiscal year. This indicates a Los Angeles decrease of but 5.3 per cent, as against 30 per cent for the country as a whole.

Collector Goodcell pointed out that 47,926 more income tax returns were filed in 1922 than in 1921. This would indicate an increase in population in Southern California of 380,000 as one out of every eight persons filed a return in 1921.

Announcement was made by Collector Goodcell that receipts for federal taxes on capital stock in corporations in Southern California for the first five months of the cur-

rent fiscal year, June 30 to December 1, were \$1,081,329.73, as compared with collections for the entire fiscal year ending June 30, 1921, of \$1,106,000. The receipts for the five months period represent federal tax paid on capital stock of Southern California corporations of an actual value of \$1,211,545,000.

Collector Goodcell's survey shows that in one year California corporations reported for taxation net income of \$283,000,000, which is greater than the combined income turned in by the twelve big Pacific Coast and Western states. The grand total of net and gross corporation and net personal income reported for California was \$5,476,600,000.

Collector Goodcell returned from Washington this week, where he was in conference with treasury officials regarding increases in office personnel and new quarters for the Los Angeles district. Every request of the collector was granted.

"The Los Angeles district's collections have placed Southern California in a class by itself and treasury officials regard this section as one of the country's greatest producers of federal revenue," said Collector Goodcell. "The eyes of the East are focused on Southern California."
