TORRANCE GETS NEW WELL

days Torrance will know whether the field extends on east of the city. With this well on production Torrance will have one of the biggest proven oil fields in area in the state.

Hard luck was encountered in both Torrance No. 4 and No. 5 on the Chanslor-Canfield Midway lease this week, the first cement job failing to shut off the water, making it necessary to re-cement. This will mean two or three weeks more before the wells will be put on production. The Standard Oil drillers are preparing to drill out the cement in Torrance Community No. 3, an offset to Torrance No. 4, and with fair luck, the Torrance field should have another good producer within the next week or ten days. The Hub's Smith No. 1 is standing cemented at 300 feet and should be ready for drilling by the middle of next week. The Hub well offsets Torrance No. 5.

Good progress is being made in both the Gilmore Petroleum Company's No. 1 well and the Hub's Frier No. 1, east and north of Smith No. 1 and it will be only a short time now before they tap the oil sand.

Torrance No. 7, east of Getty's No. 1 well is being rigged up for immediate drilling. This is the most easterly well on the big Chanslor-Canfield Midway lease.
