

### Scully & Cox Open Dolley Co. Buys Real Estate Office Gardena Pharmacy

An extension of the State Exchange Bank building is being made on the east side, to accommodate the real estate firm of Scully & Cox, new arrivals in the business life of Torrance. The room will be built of hollow tile and masonry construction, 9x23, and open on El Prado.

J. C. Scully comes from Los Angeles, but formerly was engaged in the banking business, subdividing and selling of oil lands in Oklahoma. The entire townsite of Haskell, Okla., is said to have been laid out and sold by him.

Lewis Cox came here from Venice, and for years was assistant cashier of the First National Bank of Ocean Park. They have selected Torrance as a coming city and are actively engaged in selling and listing of property even before their office is completed. Mr. Cox will be in charge of the office here.

#### NOTICE INVITING BIDS FOR PURCHASE OF FRANCHISE ON 213TH STREET.

Notice is hereby given that the Board of Trustees of the City of Torrance propose to grant a 21-year franchise for railroad lines to cross 213th Street in the City of Torrance at points designated on that certain plat on file in the office of the City Clerk of the City of Torrance and attached to the application of Union Tool Company for franchise and dated April 2, 1923. The construction work on said crossing shall be done so that the railway tracks across said street when completed shall conform to the grades of the City of Torrance and all street approaches to it shall be constructed at the expense of the grantee under said franchise.


