by Torrance Swindell and Miss Lucille Howe, and a stirring address by Chaplain Capt. Matthews of Fort McArthur, on "Americanism." Capt. Matthews talked right from the shoulder, and made a deep impression upon his audience as he defined the true meaning of "Americanism."

In a place of honor at the head on the column of marching men was S. S. Sloan, of Los Angeles, the only Civil War Veteran present.

At Memorial Park, the Rev. J. W. Morris, pastor of the Methodist church, delivered an eloquent Memorial address. The audience was visibly impressed as he paid respects to the heroes of the wars this country has taken part in. Ice Sculpture Is An Art Practiced Among Top-Notch Steamship Chefs

NEW YORK, May 31—Cooks, that is, good cooks, cooks who are dignified with the title of "Chef," are generally recognized as artists when they ably master all the details of their craft and prepare dishes not only appealing to the appetite, but pleasing to the eye. That many chefs, especially those in big hotels, and on steamships, such as the palatial passenger vessels of the United States Lines, are artists is readily admitted by the traveling public. Very few people know, however, that many of the cooks aboard the United States liners are not only artists but sculptors in an actual sense. Passengers on the President Harding, the America, President Roosevelt, the George Washington and other liners of the big American steamship organization, as well as the hundreds who visit these vessels at their Hoboken piers on sailing days have ample opportunity to see the work of these super-chefs, not only in the line of cooking, but in sculpture.

Such is not the case, however, as each piece represents hours of work with a variety of sharp tools on the part of a cook who has spent years in learning the art of ice sculpture.

Several of the chefs on the United States liners are particularly clever in fashioning decorative pieces from blocks of ice. Among these are Harry Klein, of the chef's staff of the President Roosevelt. Klein, who since a very young boy has studied the duties of a chef, starting in as a pantry boy when not yet in his teens, is often called upon by passengers to work in their presence.

With a large cake of ice from the ship's freezing plant, he starts to work, using tools similar to those employed by a sculptor in stone. With these he gradually converts the ice into practically any design required, while the passengers watch his efforts with fascination. Klein never breaks a piece of ice on which he is working, though at times in fashioning a table piece he will work down the material to the thinness of an ordinary pane of window glass.

It took this cook about three years to learn ice sculpturing, though it takes many a considerable longer time to master the art. It is taken up as a necessary adjunct by all cooks aspiring to be super-chefs, as through it more striking table decorations can be fashioned than through any other medium. When a cook is able to qualify as an ice sculptor he is admitted into the inner circle of the most capable chefs on land or sea.

Each of these tables also will hold a striking decoration, at first sight appearing to be glass, at second to be ice, which it actually is. American eagles with wings wide spread; crouching lions; elephants, life-like in every line; bridges under which sail craft fashioned from cake and icings, glisten under the lights of the dining salon, adding to the picturesqueness of the scene.

It is generally thought that these table decorations are cast in metal moulds through a freezing process.
