Torrance Theatre Features Are Best

Scheduled for presentation at the Torrance Theatre Sunday and Monday, June 10 and 11 is the Fred Niblo production, "The Famous Mrs. Fair," a photoplay version of a play which has been acknowledged as one of the most important contributions of years to the book of the American drama. If the success which it won as a stage play is any criterion for judgment, the picture should prove an unqualified success. James Forbes, American playwright, is the author of the stage play. The theme of the play and the various roles make it a thing of great humanity magnificently portrayed.

The struggle of human souls toward betterment of social conditions and mental standards has been the theme of many great pictures, but in "The Flame of Life," coming Tuesday and Wednesday, June 12 and 13, the atmosphere is strange to the screen. It is the mining country in the north of England, where people lived in squalor and ignorance in 1870, and were characterized by their masters as "little better than beasts." "The Flame of Life" was adapted from the book of Frances Hodgson Burnett and the story is considered equal to "Little Lord Fauntleroy" in coloring and atmosphere and superior in dramatic pitch. A smashing thrill in the form of a great mine catastrophe in which great tunnels and shafts actually were blown up for the picture, gives a twist to the climax, surprising and gripping.

A gang of successful, desperate crooks tried to steal the heart of a young and innocent girl violinist, turn her into a crook and use her in their big schemes. But the girl, with nothing but her sweetness and the music of her violin, turned these crooks, male and female, into paths they did not want to go. This, in brief is the story that Edwin Carewe has turned into a powerful picture, "Mighty Lak' a Rose," that is coming Thursday and Friday, June 14 and 15.

A film version of one of the most exciting sea stories of recent years is Metro's production, "All the Brothers Were Valiant," based on the story of the same name by Ben Ames Williams. It comes Saturday, June 16. Those who have read this powerful, whaling story cannot but remember it as an unusually vivid and thrilling tale. It has all the elements which go to make a thoroughly entertaining photoplay. There is a thrilling whale hunt; a bitter battle aboard ship, with two brothers temporarily on opposing sides; a search for pearls under adventurous circumstances; as well as many other episodes which should keep any audience constantly thrilled.
