

**HEALTH DEPARTMENT OUTLINES SERVICE TO TORRANCE PUBLIC; OFFICE HOURS ESTABLISHED**

The Los Angeles county health department has established a branch health office and laboratory in room 10 of the city hall, Redondo Beach, to care for the public health work of Torrance and adjacent rural territory. Any reports may be made either to the department by telephone, Redondo 66; the main office in Los Angeles, 330 North Broadway, phone Main 2300; or to the office of the city clerk, Torrance, phone 8. It is best to address mail to the Los Angeles office, as it will be received more quickly than in Redondo Beach. Specimen containers can be obtained from either laboratory. These can be mailed to the central laboratory, addressed to the Los Angeles County Health Department, 1202 Hall of Records, Los Angeles, or else taken to the district laboratory in Redondo Beach. Doctors may gain admission to the laboratory to plant cultures in a suspected diphtheria case and put it in the incubator, after office hours, by applying at the Redondo Beach police department.

For the benefit of those not familiar with the state board of health rules on diphtheria, this quotation from rule No. 2 is important: "It shall be the duty of every physician attending a case of diphtheria, or a case suspected of being diphtheria, to take swabs or cultures when required to do so by the local health authority."

The department is prepared to furnish consultation in any case of a doubtful diagnosis in the communicable diseases.

The personnel of the district health department is as follows: Medical officer—Dr. J. W. Robin-

son, whose headquarters is at the main office in Los Angeles.

Sanitary officer—O. M. McAuley Jr., whose headquarters is at the Redondo Beach district health office. He will represent the department at all times in the absence of the medical officer from the district. Any emergency should be reported to Mr. McAuley for action. After office hours he can be reached at 718 Strand, Hermosa Beach, phone 1331. Technician—Miss Anne White, whose headquarters is at the Redondo Beach district laboratory. After office hours she can be reached at 1140 Hermosa avenue, Hermosa Beach, phone 48.

Mr. McAuley will have office hours in the city clerk's office, Torrance city hall, as follows: Mondays, 2 p. m. to 3 p. m., and Tuesdays, 10 a. m. to 11 a. m.

The central laboratory will be open from 8 a. m. to 12 noon and from 1 to 5 p. m., with the exception of Saturdays, Sundays and holidays, when it will be open from 8 a. m. to 12, until the scope of work justifies a full-time schedule.

The district health office and laboratory will be open from 8 a. m. to 12 noon and from 1 p. m. to 5 p. m., with the exception of Saturdays, Sundays and holidays. It will be open Saturday forenoons from 8 a. m. to 12 noon.

All complaints on sanitation, etc., should be reported to the sanitary officer at the district office, main office, or to the city clerk of Torrance, who will refer it to Mr. McAuley when the latter makes his daily calls in this city.
