

Sewer System Would Serve Big Area



Complete and specific information regarding the proposed \$12,000,000 metropolitan sewer project, which will eventually serve virtually all of Los Angeles County outside of the incorporated limits of Los Angeles and portions of the county lying to the north, east and south. The project is being carried out in a series of districts and phases, the first of which is the construction of a common outfall sewer to the Pacific Ocean for the disposal of all the sewage originating within these districts.
