The colorful printed materials will be as popular next spring as they were the past season. This pretty frock of printed crepe de chine has a background of white with a design in brown, blue and green. Handings and side ruffle are of white.

The wraparound style has spread from coats to frocks, making an uneven hemline. It is used here. The tiny standing collar is a new feature of the spring frocks. The wide side ruffle is a graceful trimming feature. The white ribbon or banding that forms the standing collar is tied into a bow on the left shoulder just above the start of the ruffle. Wide handings are used to finish the short sleeves and a narrow sash circles the waist and ties also at the left side, which seems to monopolize all the trimming.
