Asserted Plot Nipped in Bud by Five Police

didn't have any money but, that I would get a check for \$100 and would give that to him. He refused to take a check. He threatened to kill me right there, and I agreed to pay him \$500—\$100 down on the following Saturday and \$50 a month until it was all paid."

After this meeting MacMillan took his troubles to Officer Young, who went with him to Chief Patterson, to whom MacMillan related the whole story.

Chief Patterson, scenting the possibility of a man crazed with jealousy and well armed, deemed it wise to call into the case some plainclothes men who would be unknown in Torrance. Darley and Reamer were assigned from the district attorney's office.

Marked Money
MacMillan's meeting with MacPherson was set to take place Friday afternoon on Marcelina street between 4 and 4:30. Earlier in the afternoon MacMillan cashed a check for \$100, receiving the money in bills of various denominations. The police then carefully marked the bills.

MacMillan was instructed to give the money to MacPherson as per the asserted agreement and to "tip his cap carelessly" as soon as the money was transferred.

MacMillan took position near the office of the Torrance Investment Company. Darley and Reamer parked their car near by and got out. Patterson, Phillips and Officer Stroh, in Stroh's car, parked on the other side of the street.

MacPhersons Arrive
Darley and Reamer patrolled the sidewalk on both sides of the street, keeping MacMillan in view. Soon MacPherson, accompanied by his brother, drove up in the Chevrolet and parked near MacMillan.

G. W. MacPherson got out of the car and approached MacMillan. Detectives Darley and Reamer, their hands gripping revolvers in their coat pockets, moved closer to the pair.

Across the street Chief Patterson, prepared for any emergency, sat with a double-barreled shotgun across his knees.

MacMillan touched the peak of his cap.

Darley and Reamer stepped up briskly and put the handcuffs on MacPherson.

Phillips and Stroh stepped to the running board of the car and covered the other MacPherson.

G. W. MacPherson was placed in the Torrance jail, booked for "suspicion of a felony."

Deputy District Attorney Ryan, assigned to the case, yesterday ordered the arrest of Lee MacPherson.

MacMillan asserts that he had no reason to give MacPherson money except that he was "afraid MacPherson would kill him." He declared that he had seen Mrs. MacPherson before the asserted plot was hatched, but insists that he never had slandered her or knew her other than casually.

The MacPhersons live at 351 East Sixty-fifth street, Los Angeles. G. W. MacPherson is employed for a gas company under H. R. Otto, El Prado Court, Torrance.

These showed he never had been in battle. He told them he belonged to an American Legion post in Syracuse, N. Y., but a telephone call to Syracuse brought information he never had been listed on the post's membership rolls.

"Thirty days in jail—\$20 and costs" was the sentence and fine he drew in court. The state of New York has a law on its statute books, passed in 1921, which makes it a misdemeanor for anyone not a member of the Legion to wear the Legion button. And Chatham officials asked that the law be enforced.

Thirty other states have laws similar to New York's statute for the protection of the Legion emblem. In these states the open season for lapel button grafters is all the year round.—American Legion Weekly.
