NOTICE OF FILING ASSESSMENT. For the Work of Improvement of Certain Alleys in Torrance Tract. Provided For by Resolution of Intention No. 208, Passed Nov. 17, 1924, and of the Time of Hearing as to Said Work and Said Assessment.

The undersigned, the City Clerk of the City of Torrance, State of California, hereby gives notice that on May 1, 1925, the Street Superintendent of said City, having made an assessment pursuant to direction and order of the Board of Trustees of said City to cover the sum due for the work performed and specified in the contract made under proceedings for the improvement of certain alleys in Torrance Tract, in said City, initiated by Resolution of Intention No. 208, passed Nov. 17, 1924, filed the same with me.

I hereby fix Monday, May 18, 1925, at the hour of 7:00 P. M., as the time and the Council Chamber of the Board of Trustees of the City of Torrance, in the City Hall of said City, as the place where and when all persons interested in the said assessment will be heard by the Board of Trustees.

This notice will also be published by the undersigned twice in the Torrance Herald, a newspaper published in said City. The owners, the compiler or his assigns, and all other persons interested in the said work or in the said assessment, feeling aggrieved by any act or determination of the Superintendent of Streets or City Engineer in relation thereto, or who claim that the work has not been performed according to the contract in a good and substantial manner, or who claim that any portion of the work for any reason was omitted or illegally included in the contract for the same, or having or making any objection to the correctness of the assessment or diagram or other act, determination or proceedings of the Superintendent of Streets or City Engineer, shall prior to the day fixed for the hearing upon the assessment, appeal to the Board of Trustees by briefly stating in writing the grounds of appeal.

For a description of the said work reference is hereby made to the above mentioned Resolution No. 208, passed by the Board of Trustees of said City of Torrance Nov. 17, 1924.

NOTICE CALLING FOR BIDS ON FRANCHISE

Notice is hereby given that bids will be opened on May 18, 1925, at eight o'clock P. M., by the Board of Trustees of the City of Torrance, in a regular meeting assembled, for the purchase of a franchise for the laying of pipe lines, and erection and maintenance of telephone lines along said pipe lines, within the following described boundaries in the City of Torrance, in pursuance of an application of the Petroleum Midway Company for such franchise filed with the City Clerk of the City of Torrance:

Beginning at the intersection of the easterly line of Cedar Avenue with the northerly line of Redondo Boulevard; thence westerly along the northerly line of Redondo Boulevard and the projection thereof to the City limit; thence southerly along the City limit through all its various courses and curves to its intersection with the northerly side of Plaza del Amo; thence northerly along the northerly side of Plaza del Amo to its intersection with the northerly side of Carson Street; thence westerly along the northerly side of Carson Street to its intersection with the easterly side of Cedar Avenue; thence northerly along the easterly side of Cedar Avenue to the point of beginning.

It is the intention of the Board of Trustees of the City of Torrance to issue such a franchise for a period of forty years to the highest bidder in consideration of the payment of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) per rod to the City of Torrance for each line of pipe laid, as and when the same is laid, and the further payment to the City of Torrance of Two Per Cent. (2%) of the pro rata proportion of income as provided for by the statutes of the State of California.

Said bids must be accompanied by a certified check in the sum of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) to cover the cost incident to the issuing of such franchise, and a certified check in the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) as evidence of good faith, which \$500.00 is to be returned upon the completion by the franchise holder of at least one-half of the pipe line to be laid under such franchise.
