## Bombing Planes To Raid Village In Sky Carnival

Santa Monica Aerial Exhibition Set for Armistice Day

Teaching a stirring lesson in modern aerial warfare, a spectacular sky carnival which will feature the bombing and destruction of an entire "enemy" village by 100 airplanes will be given on November 11 at Clover Field by the Clover Field Air Service, with the assistance of the Santa Monica American Legion post.

While the attacking planes circle and swoop above the village, dropping bombs, the "enemy" airplanes and anti-aircraft guns will attempt to defend the village and drive the aircraft away. At the same time new infantry tactics will be displayed by the men detailed to act as the defending army in the village under fire.

The sky carnival is to be carried out as a means of benefiting the United States army relief fund, it was decided at a meeting of the general committee from the Clover Field with American Legion men and others. Lieut. Horace S. Kenyon Jr., commander of the field; Lieut. Walter F. Parkin, operations officer; and Lieut. Cliff Henderson, also assigned to Clover Field, compose the committee designated to carry the event through to successful completion.

In order that crowds from various communities may attend the Clover Field carnival, the general committee issued a proclamation to other American Legion posts asking them to arrange their programs so that inhabitants can get away in time to reach the Santa Monica show.

The carnival should have a vast effect in creating additional interest in the art of aviation, according to Lieut. Kenyon, who announced that a crowd in excess of 100,000 persons is expected to attend. In addition to airmen from all parts of Southern California, almost a score of notable figures in the aviation world from other sections of the United States will arrive here in time to take part, it was stated. The latest in flying will be demonstrated at the carnival and tons of ammunitions and explosives will be set off in the destruction of the village. In order to avert any possibility of accidents, the crowds will be kept at a safe distance from the village, Lieut. Kenyon said.
