Board Disposes Of Much Routine Business Monday

Trustees' Meeting Is Marked by Many Minor Considerations

Much routine business was transacted by the Board of Trustees Monday night.

City Clerk Bartlett was instructed to advertise for bids for the collection of garbage. Bids will be opened Monday night, June 21. The clerk was also instructed to advertise for bids for the publishing of city legal notices. Bids will be opened Monday night, June 21. A suggestion that boulevard stops be established at the intersection of all streets with Redondo boulevard was tabled. Mayor Dennis said it is possible to have too many traffic regulations.

An ordinance was introduced cutting the salary of city marshal from \$800 to \$225 a month.

To Remove Pipes

The chairman of the board was instructed to enter into an agreement with the Torrance Water, Light and Power Company and the Dominguez Land Corporation for the removal of water pipes from under the site of the new fire station now under construction. The work will cost about \$150, to be paid by the city. The companies will surrender all rights under the alley.

An ordinance was introduced allowing billiard halls and bowling alleys to remain open until 1 o'clock Saturday night.

The police committee was authorized to purchase a desk from Louisa Patterson for \$20. The desk will be used at police headquarters.

Ask for Wig-Wag

A wig-wag signal at the intersection of the Santa Fe railroad tracks with 228th street will be requested by the board, acting on the recommendation of Trustee Tom Foley, instructed City Clerk Bartlett to make request for the installation.

The board granted the request of the George R. Curtis Company for an extension of 60 days for the completion of the pavement on Martina avenue.
