Milk Sold Here Is Given Tests; Dairies Scored

Surprise Examination Shows How Various Companies' Products Rate

A rating of 92.6 per cent was given to the Redondo health district milk supply by officials of the Bureau of Dairy Control of the California State Department of Agriculture. Redondo district of the Los Angeles County Health Department includes the following cities and towns: Redondo, Hermosa, Manhattan, El Segundo, Hawthorne, Lawndale, Lennox, Lomita, Moneta, Torrance, Woodcrest, Gardena, Waverly Palms Verdes, and adjacent country areas.

This rating was the result of a surprise milk scoring contest held in Redondo Jan. 31 to Feb. 2 by state and county officials who at irregular intervals score the milk supply, samples being taken from the regular delivery as it reaches the consumer from day to day. Sediment, flavor and odor are scored on the individual sample on the day of the contest. However, the butter-fat and solids-not-fat percentages and bacteria counts are the average of the total samples analyzed since the last surprise contest held in this district.

Milk scoring is a part of the service extended by the state department of agriculture to all local departments where milk is graded. Redondo district is on the list of approved districts where an inspection department grades its milk supply, and it actually means that such a department is guaranteeing to the public that the milk is of the quality as indicated by the grade on the bottle cap, and furthermore, that this guarantee is backed by the state department of agriculture.

Milk and milk products serve as one of the most important sources of food for all civilized nations. The more highly developed and prosperous the people, the greater the amount of milk and dairy products they consume.

McCullum in presenting results of his investigations in human nutrition, has stated, "The keeping of dairy animals was the greatest factor in the history of development of man from a state of barbarism." A large part of the best agricultural lands of the world are utilized for the keeping of dairy cattle. It is a well known fact that the most prosperous nations, as well as the best developed physically and mentally are those in which the dairy cow is the foundation of agriculture.

Judges were Dr. R. P. Gingerich, market milk specialist, State Bureau of Dairy Control, and Dr. F. P. Wilcox, director, Division of Dairy Products, Los Angeles County Health Department. Results were as follows:

BUILD AND LIVE IN TORRANCE

THE CHARM OF THE ENGLISH COTTAGE

The English cottage type of architecture is ever gaining favor for the small American home, due largely to the elusive and picturesque charm of the cottage of old England.

And, in proper hands, the American modification of these charming cottages retains most of the flavor of the old and combines with it the modern American demand of an economical, livable and convenient plan.

In the little cottage herewith illustrated the architects have drawn freely from old England for the exterior and have arranged a thoroughly modern American plan to accompany it.

The diversity of materials for the exterior, stucco, stone, brick half-timber, wood boarding and shingle lend variety and interest

and a broad low-hung roof gives the desired cottage effect.

One enters the house through a vestibule, into the living room. The stairway is centrally located so that it serves both the main rooms and the service portion of the house.

The kitchen has a breakfast nook adjoining, also a large closet. It has a complete equipment.
