To retain the colorful atmosphere  
of Spain in "Carmen," Raoul Walsh  
producing a new version of the  
classic for Fox Films, called in four  
technical advisers to make certain  
of the correctness of Spanish back-  
grounds and costumes. With the  
aid of this counsel, Walsh had  
three large street sets built, in ad-  
dition to the huge arena for the  
bullfight.

The new picture, titled "Loves of  
Carmen," comes to the Torrance

Theatre next Wednesday for three  
days.  
Exteriors and interiors of castles,  
a tobacco factory, a jail, a court-  
yard of the picturesque Moorish  
type, besides 100 miscellaneous in-  
teriors, required weeks of building.

Dolores Del Rio, of Mexican  
birth, has the title role in this  
version of "Carmen." Victor Mc-  
Laglen, as the torreador, is seen in  
an interpretation different from  
any that has ever been given the

role. This is in line with Raoul  
Walsh's new conception of the  
story, which also shows a cigar-  
ette girl as she is rather than the  
idealized portrait customary in the  
opera characterization.

Other prominent players in the  
cast are Don Alvarado, Nancy  
Nash, Mathilde Comont, Jack Vas-  
tian, Carmen Costello, Rafael Val-  
verde, a noted torreador of Mexico  
who instructed Victor McLaglen in  
the finesse of sword work for bull-  
fighting, and Fred Kohler.




