

C. W. Pendleton and H. H. Woods drove to Santa Barbara for the weekend.


Roland Sandorhoff was in Los Angeles the greater part of last week personally selecting stock for the present time, and new fall goods.

Lee Conner and Ed Tansey left Monday for a week in the Santa Susana mountains.



### DECORATIVE AWNINGS

"Nothing decorates which does not add the proper touch." In the by-word of decoration today. Awnings along with all other interior and exterior parts of the house should blend with the house they adorn and not look like so much extra material just stuck on for utility's sake. Utility and smartness go hand in hand with beauty and practicality in the modern home.



### STAKING AND TYING PERENNIALS

The staking and tying up of tall-growing or weak-stemmed perennials is one of the most important steps in the maintenance of the mid-summer garden. There is

nothing that is more disastrous than a sudden summer storm of wind and rain when the plants are left unprotected, for snapped stems and bedraggled blooms are sure to be the result. There are several points to remember in staking a plant. First have the stake of a neutral color—green, perhaps—or a color that will blend in the foliage and not make the garden look like an army of sticks. Have it long enough to be firmly bedded in the soil, and still reach as high as the plant will be likely to grow.

In tying the plant use bits of neutral colored cloth, or better yet, strands of raffia. Tie the plant loosely; don't bunch it to the stake but try to arrange it in a natural graceful manner. If we do this the garden will not have a too artificial appearance. For such plants as the Peony, Delphinium or Hollyhock, which are robust growers, we can attach them to their stakes with pieces of wire arranged in ample loops, as shown in the sketch. This arrangement allows the plant to maintain a more natural position, and to grow with greater freedom in any event do not tie the plant too tightly; allow it room to expand as it grows.
