RECIPES

Christmas Punch
Boll 1 cup water and 2 cups sugar together for 10 minutes. Add 1 cup Orange Pekoe tea, 2 cups white grape juice, juice of 5 lemons and 6 oranges and 2 cups Del Monte Crushed Pineapple and syrup. Allow to stand 30 minutes, strain and add sufficient ice water to make 1 1/2 gallons of liquid. Add 1 cup maraschino cherries and 4 cups chopped water. Pour over block of ice in punch bowl. This amount serves about 50 persons.

Ice Box Cookies
1 cup brown sugar, 1/2 cup salad oil, 1 egg, 1 1/2 cups Phillips Waffle Flour, 1/2 teaspoon nutmeg, 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon, 1 cup chopped nut meats. Knead into roll and slice off. Bake in quick oven. Can stand for days in ice before baking.


Corn Fritters


