(Continued from Page 1) ern California—a departure which saved the taxpayers here thousands of dollars.

The idea of securing guaranteed bids from makers of all types of standards before any type was specified originated in the public-spirited mind of the late George Proctor, who was at the time president of the Torrance Chamber of Commerce. The idea was presented to the city council by the Chamber of Commerce directors and the city officials grasped the idea with conviction that it would secure a splendid lighting system at low costs guaranteed by open competition.

Guaranteed bids were presented by a special committee appointed by the council. These bids, comparisons showed, were lower than those which had prevailed in other cities in Southern California. After several weeks of discussion in which all elements agreed that lights themselves were more important than any particular type of and a contract for their installation let.

Investigation has revealed that Torrance is the only city in the county and one of a very few in the state which has installed a system of uniform posts throughout its improved district. The posts here constitute a family group—beautiful combination trolley and lighting posts on Cabrillo avenue, double standard posts in the balance of the business district, tall single standard posts on several main arteries and graceful single-standard units in the residence district.

The conduits are so installed that additional posts may be put in later at a minimum of cost.
